Lorraine Jaunay

**For services to Lutheran schooling
1992 – 2018**

The Lutheran Church of Australia thankfully acknowledges the faithful and committed service of Lorraine Jaunay to Lutheran education over a period of 27 years.

Lorraine commenced her service in Lutheran education in 1992 when she joined to the staff at Faith Lutheran College, Tanunda SA. She has had a diverse involvement in many curriculum areas and was a very active and highly valued member of the Music department from 1992-2001, teaching classes at all year levels. Her development of the teaching of Composing and Arranging, utilising the emerging computer technologies was especially valued. She was a highly creative arranger and wrote a large number of scores for the Faith Concert Band, Symphonic Band and Worship Bands. She conducted the Faith Concert Band, organizing a number of community performances. Faith's Tenth Anniversary Concern at the Festival Theatre featured her arranging abilities and was enhanced by her integration of the Faith band and dance troupe in performance.

Lorraine was an efficient administrator within the music program, acting first as part-time department secretary and from 1993 as Faith's first Instrumental Program Coordinator. Faith's biennial musical productions benefited greatly from Lorraine's expertise and versatility. She worked tirelessly rehearsing students and played brass and percussion instruments in the orchestra. She also designed and made costumes for several shows with the lavish wardrobe for 'The King and I' being an unforgettable highlight.

Lorraine has also been a hardworking History teacher, always able to bring the best out of students. She had a keen interest in Australian History and shared that with her students. LIFE has been another subject she has taught with distinction. She has a passion for the outdoors and strongly supported this aspect of the curriculum attending camps and coordinating retreats. The Faith Agriculture faculty utilised Lorraine's equestrian expertise to design and teach a horse husbandry unit as part of the Year 9 Agriculture course. This was evidence of her adaptability to many different teaching situations.

In 2002 Lorraine joined the Hospitality and Textiles faculty, generously imparting her wide range of textiles skills and assisting students develop their creative talents. She challenged students to generate their ideas through design briefs and encouraged determination and persistence as students completed a myriad of different projects. Excursions to Spotlight were a highlight for many students and Lorraine's extensive knowledge of textiles guided students with final decisions and purchases. Lorraine established a Senior Textiles room at the college and students have greatly appreciated her passion for textiles. Lorraine has also assisted in the delivery of Hospitality courses at the college where her creative skills have been greatly appreciated.

Lorraine is passionate about teaching and her warmth, care of others and Christian values shine through in everything she does at the college. She is always professional in the delivery of courses and her dealings with students, parents and staff. Her faithful and conscientious service to the Lutheran Church of Australia, through her service in Lutheran education, has been outstanding and is humbly recognised through this Award.
