Preparation for service learning - guidelines

The following guidelines, activities and questions are used with year 9s as they prepare for service learning activities.

- Make contact: About one week before your placement, phone the supervisor to introduce yourself and discuss suitable clothing, start and finish times, and thank them for the opportunity etc.
- The first day: It may be a good idea to bring morning tea and lunch on the first day until you know what facilities are available.
- Be punctual: It is very important that you arrive before your start time so that you are actually ready to start work on time.
- Absences: Must be reported as early as possible to the Supervisor at the organization AND to the Service Learning Coordinator at the College.
- Challenges and concerns: Your placement may challenge your comfort level, requiring a caring, concerned and compassionate approach and will involve working with people.
- However, if you have real concerns, speak to your Supervisor if you feel comfortable, and if you feel the need, contact the Service Learning Co-ordinator at the College who will be happy to help you.
- Following instructions: During your placement you are expected to respond in a positive way to directions
 from your Supervisor. Display initiative and help where help is needed, not where you would want it to be
 needed.
- Responsibility: Where there are a number of students at one placement, be careful not to spend too
 much time together, neglecting your responsibility. Socialise only at break times. The College has a
 relationship with these organizations and opportunities for future students should not be jeopardized.
- Completing your journal: Your reflections each day are an important part of your placement. Please do
 not leave this until you have finished. Your journal is part of your assessment and is to handed in to the
 appropriate teacher by the date specified.

- Was there anything that affected your understanding of Service Learning any new insights, shifts in your approach etc?
- In what ways did you feel supported/not supported by those you worked with?
- How did you feel about your contributions to the placement?
- · Who did you like most/least? Why?
- · Was there any resistance to your work by those you worked with?
- How was this expressed? (eg quietness, protest, etc)
- How is trust developing/not developing?
- Were there any moments when you felt powerless or out of control?
- What did you feel most anxious about during your placement? How did you handle this?
- What gifts did you use during your placement?
- Did you have any significant conversations with people either at your placement or about it?
