Title: Bye Bye Buy Buy

Category: What is the role of Lutheran Schools in developing wise citizens of the 21st century?

Workshop

Part of being a 'wise' citizen in today's world is having a balanced view, with the understanding and confidence to question and resist the BUY BUY BUY attacks of marketing and consumerism. Young people deserve the opportunity to gain a broader and deeper understanding of social justice and poverty issues than that provided by much of the media - a counter-balance to the 'me first' culture that predominates.

ALWS offers an eyewitness view into a different world, where students can come upclose to poverty, and discover solutions that work. At the same time they'll see Christianity stepping outside of church buildings to walk in the footsteps of Jesus to serve the poor (Matthew 25) and bring justice (Micah6:8).

This workshop will explore real human examples of service and action, rather than just theory. Current world issues will be explored, and teachers assisted in creating 'products' and methods that enable engagement – on the front line and in the classroom.
