Getting started

- Review your role statement and reflect on those areas that are areas of strength and challenge.

Conversations with the principal

- Meet with your principal to discuss your role statement, priorities, long and short term goals for improving and innovating in Christian Studies.
- What support do you need to achieve the priorities and goals?

Conversations with your Christian Studies teacher team

- What is the shared vision for Christian Studies and the role of Christian Studies leader?
- How will you collaborate to improve student learning in Christian Studies?

Develop a plan based on your conversations including who will be responsible for each aspect.
