Rosslyn Schubert

For services to Lutheran schooling 1973-1981 and 1986-2017

The Lutheran Church of Australia thankfully acknowledges the faithful and committed service of Rosslyn Schubert to Lutheran education for almost 37 years.

Rosslyn commenced her service in Lutheran education in 1973 when she joined the staff of Lobethal Lutheran School in South Australia. After four years at Lobethal, she took up various relief teaching contracts at both Lutheran and government schools. In 1981 Rosslyn taught for six months as a part time special education teacher at Spring Head Lutheran School (now known as Unity College Spring Head) in Mount Torrens SA. In 1986 Rosslyn re-joined the staff at Spring Head Lutheran school where she served continuously at Spring Head until her retirement in 2017.

Rosslyn has been a loyal and dedicated educator who has served with distinction and diligence. She is a great classroom practitioner who has shown genuine care and concern for the wellbeing, development and growth of her students, particularly those students with special needs. Rosslyn recognised individual strengths and differences, and brought out the best in her pupils.

Rosslyn demonstrated her own love of learning by participating in a range of professional learning opportunities in order to keep improving her teaching practice.

Rosslyn is committed to her Christian faith and this shone through in all she undertook. Her values have been clearly evident the relationships she developed with students, parents and staff. She has been a conscientious, and caring member of the school community who will be remembered by her staff colleagues for her genuine concern and empathy.
