For services to Lutheran schooling 1998 – 2018

The Lutheran Church of Australia thankfully acknowledges the faithful and committed service of Fady Ibrahim to Lutheran schools for 21 years.

Fady commenced his service in Lutheran schools when he joined the staff at St Peters Lutheran College, Indooroopilly Qld, in 1998 as a teacher of Computing and Information Technology.

As a teacher Fady was highly respected by the students in his care. His classes were characterised by the positive working relationships that he developed with each of them.

For much of his time at St Peters, Fady served as either the Computing Coordinator or the Head of Computing. In this role, he was instrumental in the introduction and development of Information Processing Technology (IPT) and Information Technology Systems (ITS) as senior subjects in Years 11 and 12. In more recent years Fady was also responsible for pioneering Digital Technologies and Robotics.

Beyond the classroom Fady made a very significant contribution to the growth and development of Football (Soccer) as a sport at St Peters. He was very much the 'Face of Football' at St Peters. For eight years he served as Football Coordinator raising the profile, standard and standing of the sport amongst the community to the point that it became the most popular winter season sporting activity at the college. St Peters Football owe Fady a great deal as a result of his selfless service and leadership to the sport.

Beyond the football fields Fady also served as House Patron for Chisholm and as a Manager for the Track and Field Team.

Fady's colleagues appreciated the fun and humour he brought to the staffroom whilst always maintaining a highly professional approach to all that he did.
