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## LEA invited to meet with National School Resourcing Board

LEA was delighted to recently receive an invitation to consult with the NSRB. Stephen Kroker (LEA Business Manager) and Stephen Rudolph met with representatives of the NSRB and Federal Department of Education and discussed the SES Review, current funding challenges for Lutheran systems and Lutheran schools and future funding needs of and preferences for Lutheran schools. This opportunity and invitation was an acknowledgement of the recognition of the excellent work being done by Lutheran systems and Lutheran schools for many years and was deeply appreciated.

LEA has also and will continue to consult with ISCA and at this stage is pleased to support the ISCA submission to the NSRB. The ISCA submission is attached for your information.

### PM writes to principals to tackle bullying

The Prime Minister, Malcolm Turnbull, has written to every school principal across Australia urging them to tackle online bullying and violence. Mr Turnbull has invited principals to launch anti-bullying programs including the establishment of 'pledge walls' where children can promise to make their school free from bullying.

Additionally, a National Day of Action against bullying and violence will be held on 16 March 2018. ## National review of teacher registration panel meets

[13 February 2018]

The National Review of Teacher Registration Expert Panel recently came together to agree on ways of working. The panel has been formed in response to all Australian Education Ministers agreeing to the National Review of Teacher Registration. The Review will look at whether registration requirements are consistently and robustly applied across Australia to help ensure every Australian learner experiences quality teaching. Panel members agreed that the key for the review is to focus on the extent to which there is national consistency and rigour in teacher registration processes across the country in terms of the application of the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers (Teacher Standards).

### My School 2018

[27 February 2018]

ACARA have advised that the My School website has been updated with:

- 2017 NAPLAN results for schools
- 2017 school profile and population data
- 2016 school financial information, including capital expenditure and sources of funding.

They have also redeveloped the site to make it mobile-friendly, easier to use and more engaging for visitors.

In consultation with state and territory education authorities, using statistically-sound analysis of school results, ACARA has identified schools with substantially above average gain in NAPLAN results.
