For service to Lutheran education 1998 – 2021

The Lutheran Church of Australia thankfully acknowledges the faithful and committed service of Peter O'Sullivan to Lutheran education for 23 years.

Peter commenced at Grace Lutheran College in 1998 teaching Science, Christian Studies, Physical Education, and Mathematics in recent years. For his entire length of service, he has embodied and faithfully witnessed to the Christian mission of the school, both as a professional teacher and as a man of unwavering integrity and personal conduct.

In the spirit of the parable of the talents from the Bible, Peter has been blessed with many natural gifts and has honoured God by faithfully investing these into his service of and for the benefit of the students and the community around him.
