Rita is not only dedicated to her classroom teaching role but has made a significant investment in the wider community at Immanuel. She assisted with many co-curricular opportunities for students, including Voices on the Coast, the Immanuel Arts Festival, various musicals, the Year 11 Moreton Island Leadership Camp, and the volleyball tours to Toowoomba and the Gold Coast, where she was both an enthusiastic cheerleader and a bus driver!

Across her roles and responsibilities that have included Year Level Coordinator positions for many years, and as well as Head of Moreton House, Rita has used her friendly and energetic demeanour to support her colleagues and guide her students. When she was the Year 12 Coordinator, her colleagues recall seeing how Rita used her words to heal, teach and love her students as they made their way through their Senior year. While students sat on her 'magic couch' next to her desk, she offered them enormous reassurance and support, helping them to navigate all manner of personal and academic problems.
